Course Code:	3262I
Purpose	The purpose of the Oxygen Administration Instructor course is to train instructor candidates to teach the American Red Cross Oxygen Administration courses.
Prerequisites	Possess a current <i>American Red Cross Health and Safety Services Instructor Authorization (F5736 or C3005)</i> that includes adult CPR.
Learning Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Expand on information from the American Red Cross Fundamentals of Instructor Training (FIT) course to teach the Oxygen Administration courses;• Demonstrate the characteristics required of an American Red Cross representative and role model;• Plan, organize and conduct the Oxygen Administration program courses.• Monitor participants' practice and provide corrective feedback and encouragement;• Teach courses and modules in a manner that keeps participants engaged in the learning process;• Ensure participants' health and safety during training;• Demonstrate oxygen administration skills at an appropriate level of performance; and• Maintain complete and accurate records and reports.
Length	Approximately 6 ¾ hours (based upon 6 instructor candidates)
Instructor	Currently authorized Oxygen Administration, Lifeguarding or Emergency Response instructor trainer.
Certification Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Successfully complete the precourse session;• Attend and participate during all course sessions;• Successfully complete one practice-teaching assignments; and• Score at least 80 percent on the instructor written exam.
Certificate Issued and Validity Period	Oxygen Administration Instructor - Authorization is for 2 calendar years. All authorizations expire on December 31st. The initial authorizations period coincides with the expiration of the initial eligibility authorization and may be less than 2 years. Remains valid as long as the American Red Cross instructor authorization, which includes adult CPR (F5736 or C3005) is maintained.
