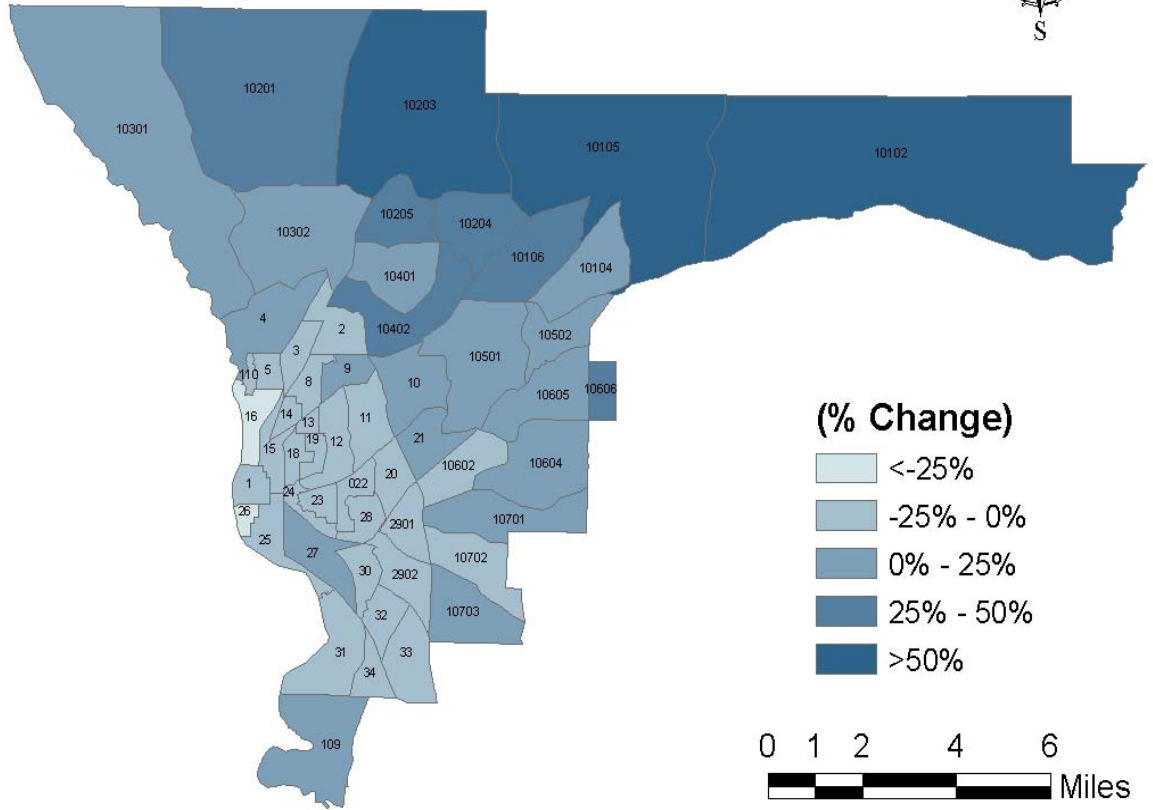
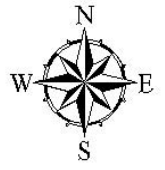

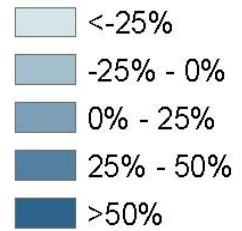
POPULATION CHANGE

- According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the population of Muscogee County increased almost 4% between 1990 and 2000.
- The city population grew by 7,602 people.
- More than 7,000 people moved into Muscogee County in the 1990's.

(% Change)

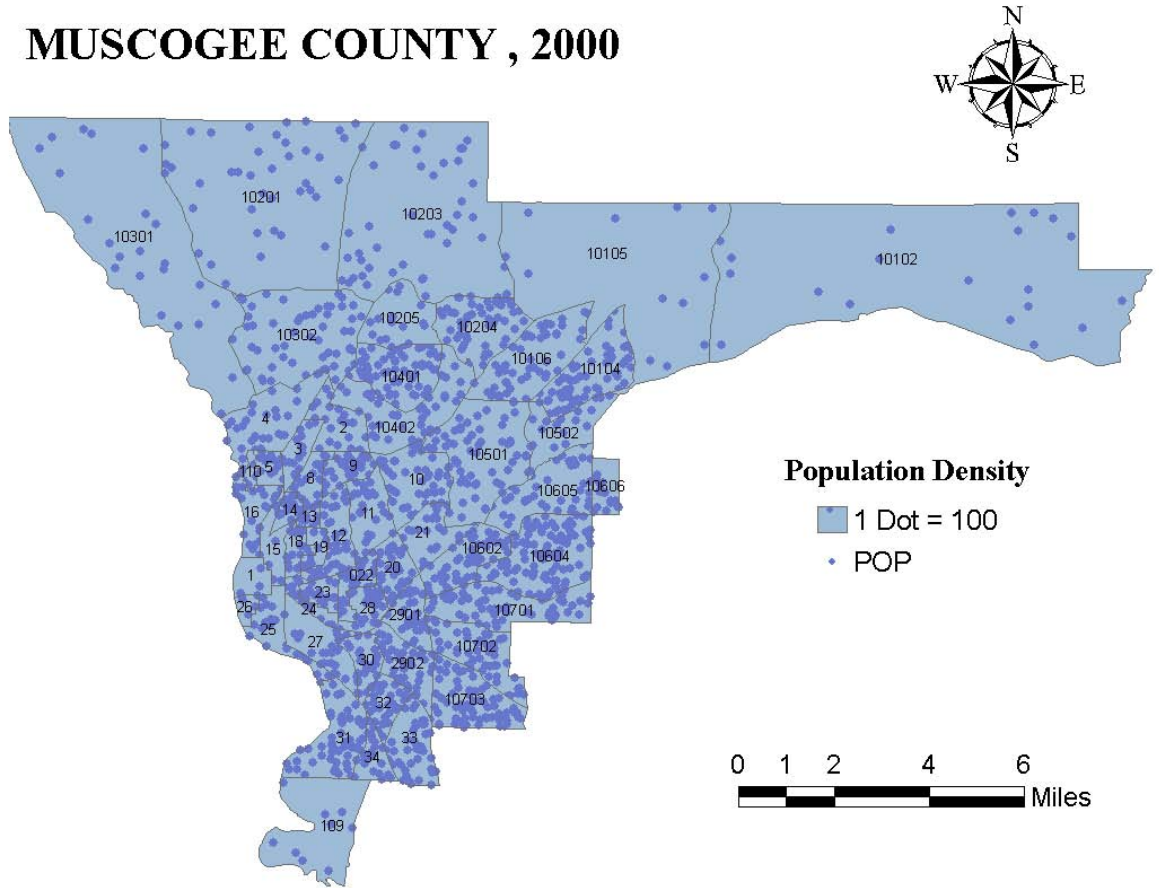

HOUSING DENSITY

- During the '90s, the gain in the number of housing units paralleled the gain in the number of households. Housing units grew by 7.4%, and households by 6%.
- In 1990, rentals accounted for 43% of all housing units. In 2000, this number slightly fell to 40%. Homeownership increased from 50% in 1990 to 52% in 2000.
- Vacant properties represented 8.4% of all housing units in 2000. This amount is 1.3% higher than the 1990 vacancy rate of 7.1.

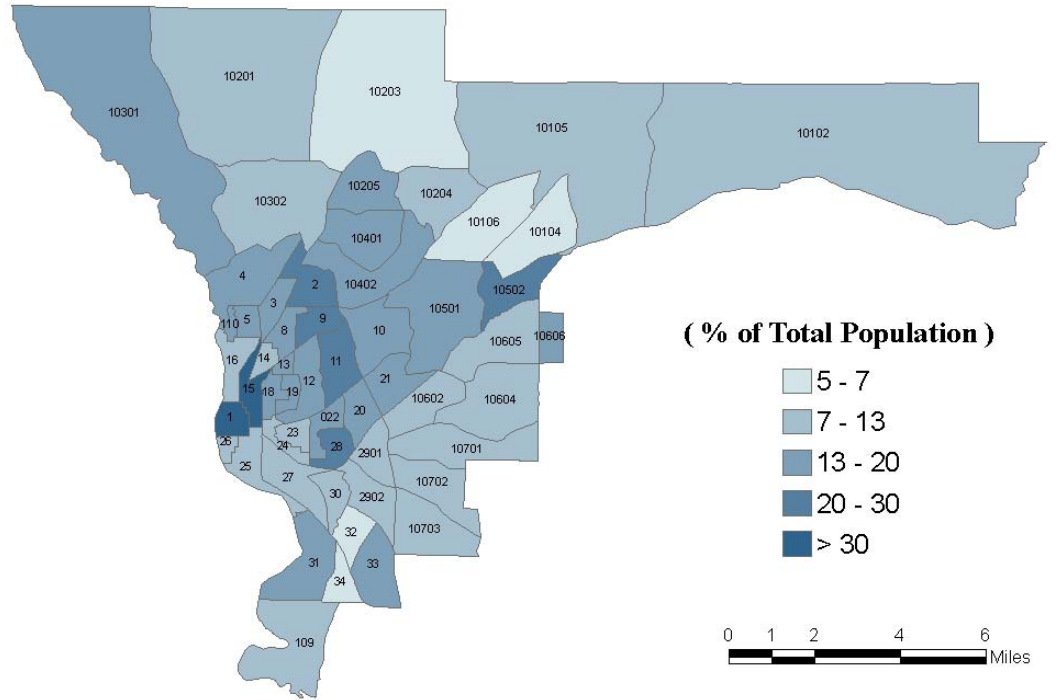

AGE

- The school age population, ages 5-19 years, increased 6% between 1990 and 2000.
- The young adult population, ages 25-34 years, declined by 5,261 during the '90s. The youngest adults, ages 20-24, showed a small lose, decreasing -0.6%.
- The Baby Boomer population was responsible for a 39% increase in the 45-54 age group during the '90s. In 1990, people age 45-54 comprised 9.1% of the total population. By 2000, this age group grew to a 12% share.
- The senior citizen population 75 years and over showed the next largest percentage increase with 26.2% between 1990 and 2000.
- The median age population of Muscogee County dropped from 33.0 years in 1990 to 32.6 in 2000.

(65 Years and Over)

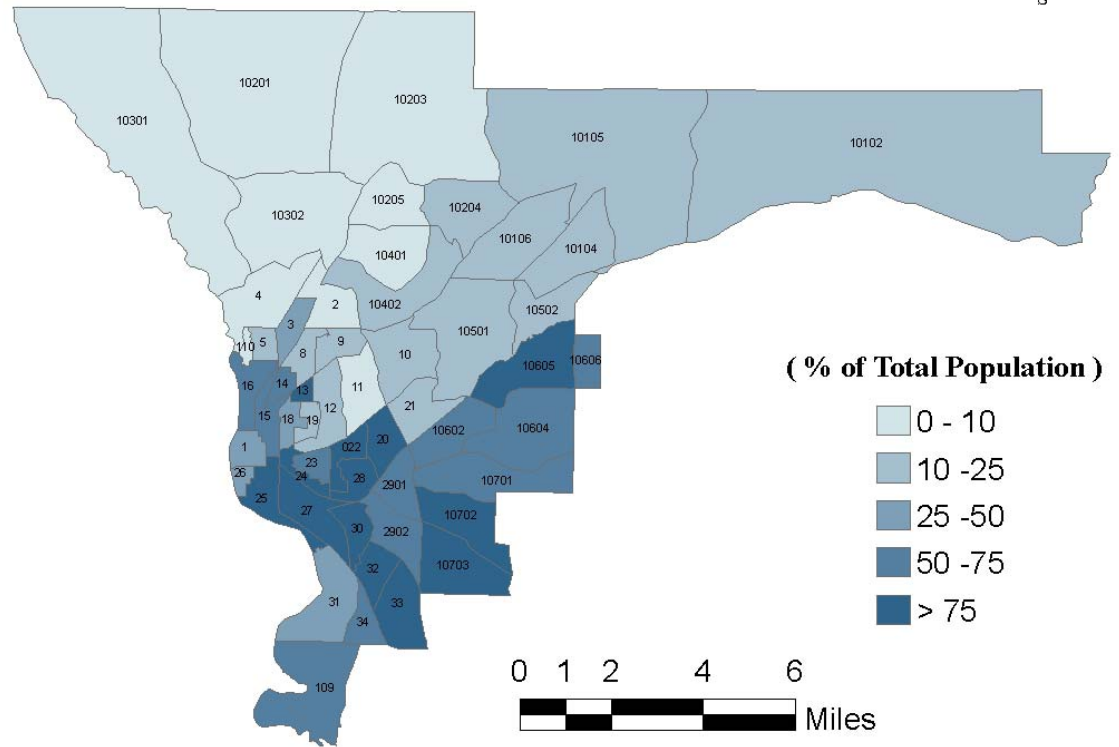

RACE:

- In 2000, the Black or African American population in Muscogee County represented 43.7% of the total population.
- The percentage of the White population in Muscogee County continued to fall, from 58.9% in the '90s, to 50.4% in 2000.
- The Native American population saw a considerable population change of 25.8% from 1990 to 2000.

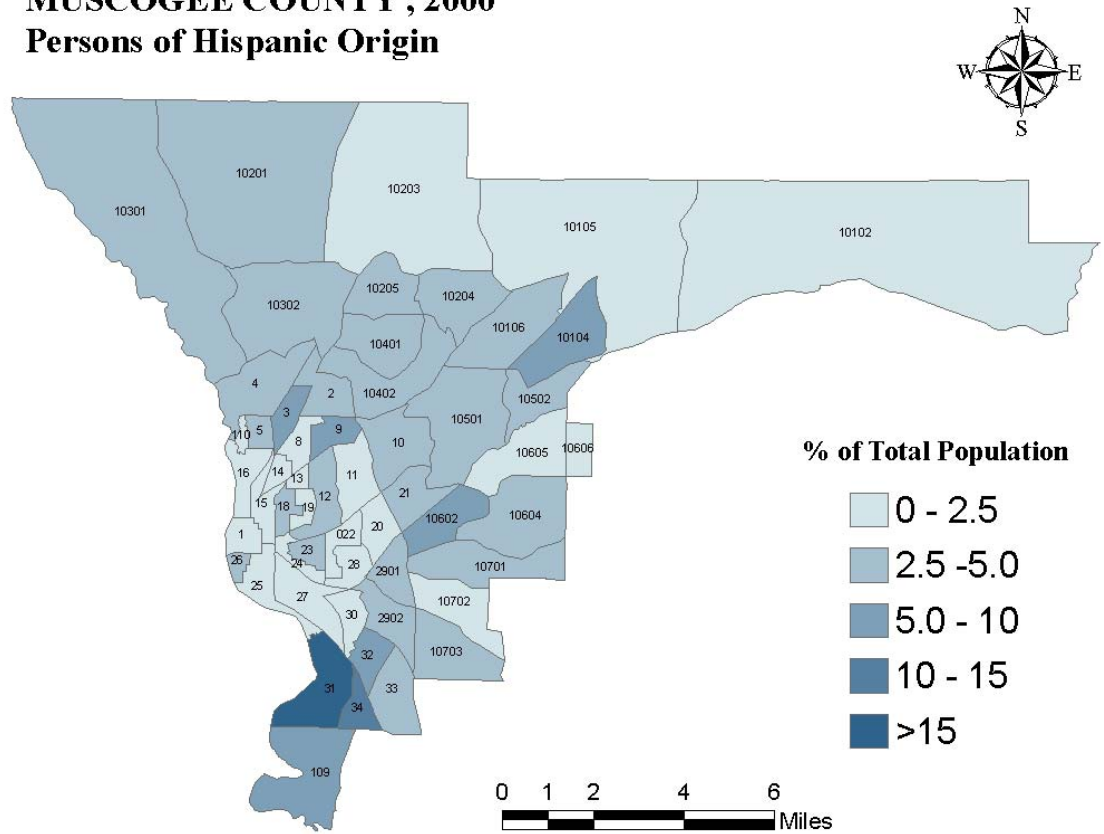

RACE:

- The Asian and Pacific Islander population increased from 1.4% of the total population in 1990 to 1.7% of the total population in 2000. The Asian population grew 27.1% between 1990-2000.
- “Other” race category and those who classified themselves as more than two races represented 3.8% of the total population, a large change 208.3% between 1990 (2,276 of total population) – 2000 (7,017 of total population).
- The Hispanic population saw an enormous increase of 58.1% between 1990 and 2000. The Hispanic population represents the third largest racial group. They account for 4.5% of the total population.

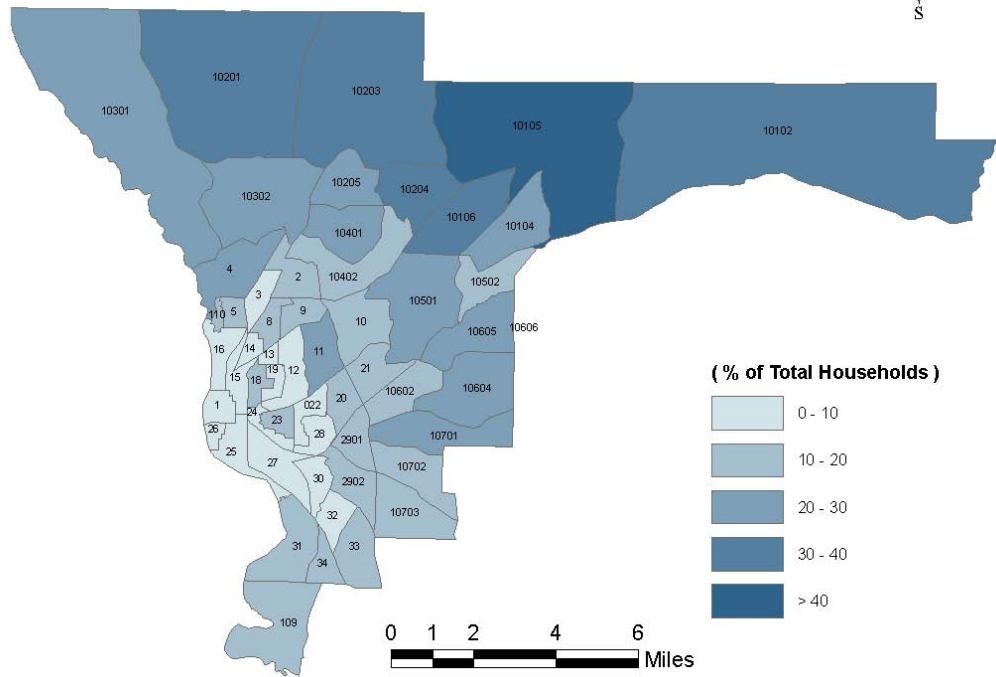

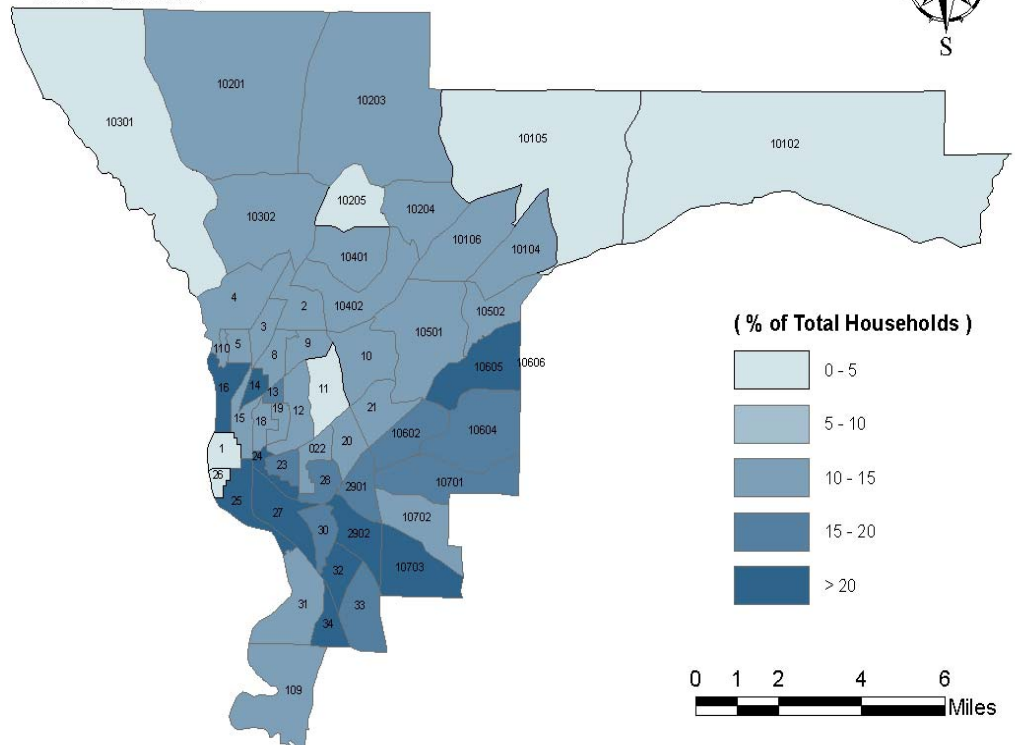
FAMILY STRUCTURE

- The total number of households in Muscogee County increased, while the average household size continued to decline. The average household size of Muscogee County was 2.54 in 2000. The national average was 2.59, a drop from 2.82 in 1990.
- In 2000, family households held a 68.3% share of the Muscogee County total. Families lost ground significantly in Muscogee County since 1980 when the share was 76.1% of all households.
- The proportion of married couple households to the total number of households continued to decline. In 1980, married couples held a 58.3% share. By 2000, this dropped to 44.6%.
- In Muscogee County, 20.6% of households were married couples with children, lower than the national average of 23.5%.

GENDER

■ Muscogee County's male increased by 3,494 during the 1990s. The number of women grew by 3,519. In 2000, the gender balance was 48.6% male and 51.4% female. The national split is 50.9% female, 49.1% male. There are approximately 95 males for every 100 females.
